Environmentally Friendly

The Abitibi Paper Retriever[®] program has been recognized nationally for its successful recovery rate. Abitibi is an end user of the paper they collect. Recovered paper is directed to processing centers where it is sorted into various grades and prepared for shipment. It is then routed to de-inking facilities and mills where it is used to manufacture recycled content newsprint. By diverting this paper from the waste stream, we estimate that over 2.2 million cubic yards of landfill space is saved each year. By eliminating groundwood and kraft pulping operations at certain newsprint mills, Abitibi-Consolidated has also reduced air emissions and wastewater discharges.
