



MEET THE 2013 BETHEL PARK ATHLETIC HALLOF FAME INDUCTEES

The Bethel Park Athletic Hall of Fame will induct seven new members on Friday, December 20 at the half time of the Bethel Park High School Boys Varsity Basketball Game against Moon. The induction will take place in the gymnasium.

The members of the Class of 2013 include:

- **Chris Buzzi** (*Class of 1989/Baseball*) – Chris was a three year letterman and starting shortstop on the Baseball Team, which won three consecutive Section Championships from 1987 through 1989. He was a member of the 1987 WPIAL Champions and the 1988 PIAA State Champions. He was named All-Section three times and All-WPIAL twice and won the WPIAL Batting Championship in 1988 with a .615 average. He played baseball for Penn State, where he was a three year letterman and guided the Nittany Lions to the 1991 Atlantic 10 Championship Game.
- **Michele Davidovich** (*Class of 1987/Softball*) – Michelle earned varsity letters all four years at Bethel Park and was Team Captain for three of those years. She led the Lady Hawks to the WPIAL Playoffs in 1986 and 1987 and to the State Championship game in 1987, where the Lady Hawks earned the Silver Medal. She was named to the WPIAL All-Section Team four times. In Volleyball, she was a four year letter winner and two year Team Captain, where she guided the Lady Hawks to two Section Championships in 1985 and 1986. She played for Southern Illinois University.
- **Joe Lodge** (*Cross Country, Wrestling, Track Coach and Athletic Director*) -- Joe started the Boys Cross Country Program at Bethel Park and served as the team's coach from 1962-

1973. Under his direction, his teams were WPIAL Champions in 1964 and 1966. He also started the Wrestling Program at Bethel Park and served as Head Coach from 1967-1979. Joe was the Assistant Boys Track and Field Coach from 1963 through 1973. He served as the Bethel Park Athletic Director from 1979-1997 and under his guidance Bethel Park won 38 WPIAL Championships and 13 PIAA Championships. He was also a Founding Member of the Bethel Park Athletic Hall of Fame Committee and served on the Committee from 1998-2008.

- **Frank Lucido** (*Class of 1962/Football, Basketball and Track*) – Frank was a three year varsity letterman on the football team, where he played offensive guard, linebacker, special teams and kicker. He was Co-Captain in 1961 and selected First Team All-Conference, All-WPIAL and All-State. In basketball, he was a two year letterman and was a member of the 1962 Section Champion Team. He is a three year letterman in track and still holds the Bethel Park High School Record in Discus, with a throw of 156', 6.5". He won the Silver Medal at the WPIAL Championships and medaled at the State Championships. In college, he was the Captain of the Slippery Rock football team in 1965 and was named First Team All-Conference, All-State and an NAIA All-American. He also served as a Bethel Park High School Assistant Football and Track Coach and an Assistant Coach on the 1983 Penguin Cup Champion Bethel Park High School Hockey Team.
- **Michael Partyka** (*Class of 1982/Soccer*) – Michael was a four year letterman and Team Captain in 1980 and 1981. He was twice named to the WPIAL All-Section Team (1980 and 1981) and was All-WPIAL and All-State in 1981. He led the Hawks in scoring in 1981 and is currently third on the Bethel Park All-Time Goal Scorers List. He earned an athletic scholarship to Slippery Rock.
- **Josh Rudinsky** (*Class of 1997/Swimming*) – Josh was a member of four WPIAL Championship Teams from 1994-1997 and two PIAA State Championship Teams in 1995 and 1996. He helped the team to those titles by being the WPIAL 100 Meter Breastroke

Champion from 1995-1997 and the 1997 WPIAL Champion in the 200 Meter Individual Medley. He was the PIAA State Champion in the 100 Meter Breaststroke in 1996. He was a member of the 200 Meter Medley Relay Team that won the WPIAL Championship in 1996 and the 200 Meter Freestyle Relay that won the 1995 WPIAL and PIAA Championships. He also qualified for the Olympic Trials. In college he swam for the University of Wisconsin and was an All-American in the 400 Yard Medley Relay.

- **Brad Stewart** (*Class of 2003/Football, Track and Field*) – Brad was a three year varsity letterman and starting offensive and defensive tackle on the football team that reached the WPIAL quarterfinals in 2001 and 2002. In 2002, he was Team Co-Captain, Third-Team All-State, All-Conference and selected to play in the 2003 East-West State All-Star Game. He was the Fellowship of Christian Athletes 2002 Athlete of the Year. In Track, he was a four year letterman in shot put and discus and the 2002 and 2003 WPIAL Shot Put Champion and Discus Medalist. He medaled at States in Shot Put in 2002 and 2003. Additionally, he was the 2003 YMCA Scholar Athlete of the Year. He attended William and Mary where he was the Co-Captain of the Football Team in 2007 and was All-Conference in 2007.

Also to be recognized with the Distinguished Contribution Award for remarkable service will be

John Deans, Boys Assistant Soccer Coach from 1976-1990; Girls Assistant Soccer Coach from 1991-1999; and Girls Assistant Basketball Coach from 1979-1997.
