



MEET THE 2021

BETHEL PARK ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME INDUCTEES

1. **Mickey Carlson (1953)** – A four-year member of both the varsity football and baseball teams, as well as adding a pair of letters in basketball, Mr. Mickey Carlson was one of the catalysts in the backfield of our undefeated football team in 1951. He accumulated 18 touchdowns in his career. Additionally, as the ace pitcher on the baseball team, helped the team capture a pair of section championships in 1950 & 1952.
2. **Dr. Patricia Downey (1976)** – One of the pioneers of female athletics, Dr. Patricia Downey earned an impressive **NINE** varsity letters. A three-year Varsity letter winner in Volleyball, Basketball and Softball, she also served as team captain on all three teams, and helped guide the Lady Hawks to their first ever Section title in softball in 1975. She went on to play softball collegiately at Division I West Virginia University.
3. **Rhonda Phillips (1978)** – Helped the Bethel Park Girls Swim Team win Four Consecutive WPIAL Championships (1975-1978), while twice capturing the gold medal at the WPIAL Diving Championships, and adding a PIAA silver medal, and WPIAL silver medal to her hardware collection. She also placed 16th at the 1976 National Diving Championships. She went on to star at Clarion University, where she was a 3X Division II National Champion, 4X All-American Diver, and a 6X PSAC Diving Champion. She returned to Bethel Park as an assistant coach to both the Boys and Girls Swim Teams (1983-1990), where she helped the teams capture a combined 12 WPIAL championships and Five State Titles.
4. **JJ Schumacher (2002)** – One of the best three-sport athletes of his era, he collected seven varsity letters. A 3-year starter on the basketball team, this All-Section selection amassed 914 career points. Additionally, as a 3-year starter on the soccer team, he notched 36 goals, earning both All-Section and All-South Area laurels. Then in spring of his senior year, he won the WPIAL Long Jump Gold Medal. He went on to play basketball collegiately at UPJ, where he was a 3-year starter, scoring over 500 career points, tallying over 400 assists, collecting over 300 rebounds, and accumulating over 100 steals.
5. **Justin Glock (2002)** – A four-year varsity starter on the ice hockey team, he helped guide the Black Hawks to three consecutive Penguin Cups and State Championships (2000-2002), including scoring the game-winning goal in OT of the 2002 state championship game. The Two-Time PIHL All-Star, Two-Time Member of the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette Stellar Six, the Two-Time Almanac Hockey MVP, and 2002 Pittsburgh Tribune-Review High School Player of the Year, were among his accolades. He went on to play collegiately at both Ohio University, where helped the OU Bobcats Win the 2004 ACHA National Championship, and the University of Pittsburgh.



6. **Bre Ford (2011)** – A gridiron great, who lettered four years in football, while playing running back and safety for the Hawks. He rushed for over 3,500 yards and scored 51 touchdowns in his career, while twice earning a place on the prestigious Pittsburgh Post-Gazette All-WPIAL Fabulous 22. He also twice earned All-Conference and Almanac All-Star honors. He helped the Black Hawks capture a pair of Conference titles, the 2008 WPIAL Championship, and a trip to Hershey for the state finals. He went on to play collegiately at the University of Akron, where he was a four-year letter winner for the Zips, amassing 105 tackles, 4 fumbles and 3 interceptions. He also played professionally for the Wichita Falls Nighthawks of the Indoor Football League.
7. **Paul Studt** – For outstanding contributions and remarkable service to Bethel Park Athletics, for SELFLESS ACTS OF KINDNESS TO CAPTURE BETHEL PARK ATHLETIC MEMORIES AND MOMENTS THROUGH PHOTOGRAPHY, AND PRESERVE THEM ON HIS WEBSITE DEDICATED TO OUR ATHLETES.
