All members (even inductees) must have a minimum of 35 community service hours each year. Additionally, every new and current member of NHS submits a Leadership check sheet each year. Inductees must complete the application as well as obtaining two recommendations from their teachers. The application for NHS membership can be found on our webpage (<http://www.bpsd.org/hsNHS.aspx>), but only students who meet our QPA requirements will receive a letter inviting them to join.

Bethel Park Student Club/Activities Guide

[The following information is taken from the Bethel Park School District Policy: 122.](#)

Definition: For purposes of this policy, **extracurricular activities** shall be those programs that are sponsored or approved by the Board and are conducted wholly or partly outside the regular school day; are marked by student participation in the processes of initiation, planning, organizing, and execution; and are equally available to all students who voluntarily elect to participate.

Participation Policy

Clubs must follow district policy 103 and provide an equal opportunity for all students to achieve their maximum potential through the programs and activities offered in the schools without discrimination on the basis of race, color, age, creed, religion, sex, gender (including gender identity or expression), sexual orientation, ancestry, national origin, marital status, pregnancy or handicap/disability.

Policies Governing Student Activities

1. It is the duty of the staff sponsor/advisor to keep all student participants informed of rules, expectations, and guidelines.
2. It is the duty of the club sponsor advisor to develop a meeting schedule, which will be provided to the building principal or designee.
3. The club sponsor advisor will be responsible for all field trip requests as outlined in Board/District Policy.
4. The club sponsor advisor must seek permission of building administration, make requests for bus transportation, and seek parent/guardian permission.
5. The club sponsor advisor must be available to his/her students during the entire meeting.
6. The club sponsor advisor should advise students in the organization that students may not transport other students on field trips without parent written permission and approval by building administration.
7. All activities beyond normal meeting dates should be approved by the building administration and placed on the school calendar.
8. Club sponsor advisors must adhere to all fundraising /donation policies as outlined by [Board Policy 229](#) and [Board Policy 702.1](#).
9. The club sponsor advisor must maintain a list of the club's members, attendance records, and provide the necessary materials as needed in the annual report.

Organization Requirements

To be considered an active club, the club must have met all the following requirements during the previous school year:

1. Minimum membership of 14 students (1% of student population), unless otherwise approved by BPHS administration.
2. Follow district [Policy 103](#) and provide an equal opportunity for all students to achieve their maximum potential through the programs and activities offered in the schools without discrimination on the basis of race, color, age, creed, religion, sex, gender (including gender identity or expression), sexual orientation, ancestry, national origin, marital status, pregnancy or handicap/disability.
3. Student roster of club members must be submitted annually to the BPHS student activities secretary.
4. Clubs should meet bi-weekly or monthly, but are required to meet a minimum of 9 times per school year.
5. Student sign-in sheets must be completed and maintained by the club sponsor for each meeting and available if requested by building administration or designee.

6. Clubs connected to funding must adhere to the requirements associated with the appropriate account.
7. The club sponsor advisor will be responsible for all field trip requests as outlined in [Board/District Policy 231](#) and [Policy 241](#).

How to Form a New Club

Starting a club can be a challenging, yet rewarding experience. Bethel Park has a rich history of clubs that serve the diverse interests of our students. Before beginning the process of creating a new club, we ask that you first look at the descriptions of our current clubs and activities to see if your ideas may fit into an existing club. Duplicating ideas or having multiple clubs with too many similarities is not in the best interest of our school community. However, if you have a unique idea and a strong desire to have a positive impact on our school by forming a new club, please carefully read the following information regarding requirements and complete the [Application for a New Student Activity Club](#).

**** New club formation and applications will be submitted for consideration once a school year in the spring. All new club applications will be shared with the School Board for consideration. Students may be requested to present their proposals and be available for questions if needed.***

Establishment of a New Student Activity Club: The Board recognizes the educational values inherent in student participation in extracurricular activities and supports the concept of student organizations for such purposes as building social relationships, developing interests in a specific area, and gaining an understanding of the elements and responsibilities of good citizenship. It is expected that new Club pursuits will arise over time and students seeking club status need to meet the following in order to establish a new Club:

1. Club topics must be safe and school appropriate. **The school district reserves the right to deny Club status to any organization should it be deemed that the activity presents issues, and is not aligned with the best interest of the District.**
2. Club Sponsor must be a staff member of the school district.
3. Minimum membership of 14 students (1% of student population), unless otherwise approved by the school board.
4. Follow district [Policy 103](#) and provide an equal opportunity for all students to achieve their maximum potential through the programs and activities offered in the schools without discrimination on the basis

of race, color, age, creed, religion, sex, gender (including gender identity or expression), sexual orientation, ancestry, national origin, marital status, pregnancy or handicap/disability.

5. Initial student roster of club members must be submitted with the application.
6. Clubs should meet bi-weekly or monthly, but are required to meet a minimum of 9 times per school year.
7. Student sign-in sheets must be completed and maintained by the club sponsor for each meeting and available if requested by building administration and/or the school board.
8. Clubs connected to funding must adhere to the requirements associated with the appropriate account.
9. The club sponsor advisor will be responsible for all field trip requests as outlined in [Board/District Policy 231](#) and [Policy 241](#).

Any new Club will enter a 3-year provisional period to determine the sustainability of the program. Clubs that have successfully completed the provisional period will be eligible to apply for permanent status in year 4 and will be taken to the board for approval.

During the provisional period, the Club will be authorized to:

1. Use Bethel Park High School facilities to meet.
2. Host events and activities with principal approval.
3. Have an activity fund after year 1 when applicable as defined in [Board Policy 618](#).
4. Inclusion in the student yearbook.

At the conclusion of each school year during the 3-year provisional period, the end of year annual report must be submitted to the Student Activities Office for school board review of compliance by May 31st in order to maintain provisional status. This report must include:

1. Dates and attendance records of all meetings.
2. Description of events and activities sponsored by the Club.
3. Activity fund budget with expenses and revenues (if applicable).
4. Rationale for continued Club status.

Failure to meet the May 31 deadline and/or incomplete reports may result in the loss of recognition of provisionary club status and the privileges associated with it. If the Club completes the 3-year provisional period, the club sponsor/student representative may apply to receive permanent Club status when completing the third school year. ** During the provisional period **the School District reserves the right to review, renew and/or withdraw a Club's status at any time or for any reason.**
