



## MEET THE BETHEL PARK ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2007

Bethel Park High School inducted six new members into its Athletic Hall of Fame on Friday, October 5.

Members of the Class of 2007 are:

- **Marc Allemang** (*Class of 2001/Wrestling*). Marc was a four-year varsity letter winner in four different weight classes; a 2000 Section Champion and three time qualifier for the WPIAL Tournament. He finished his high school career with 93 wins.

He continued his wrestling career at Duquesne University, where he was a four-year varsity starter and letterman, as well as a 3-time East Region Champion and twice named East Region Outstanding Wrestler. He qualified for the NCAA Tournament three times and in 2005 entered the NCAA's with the most single season victories in the country with 41.

- **Emily Carter** (*Class of 2001/Swimming*) was an 11-time High School All American and a member of three WPIAL Champion Teams and two State Champion Teams at Bethel Park. She owns seven WPIAL Gold Medals and five PIAA Gold Medals; two WPIAL records, one State record, three pool records and four school records. She is the only Bethel Park swimmer to qualify for the Olympic Trials.
- **Quentin Currie** (*Class of 1958/Football*) was a three time varsity letter winner as he played center and linebacker for the Black Hawks. He attended Slippery Rock College where he was a four year letterman and starter as a center. He was the Co-Captain of the 1961 Western Division PSAC Championship Team and was selected as a member of the PASC All-Conference Team. He was also named to the *Pittsburgh Press* All District Second Team and the Associated Press All-State Third Team.

Following college, he had a long career in coaching. He was a teacher, football coach and Assistant Athletic Director at Erie McDowell High School;

Head Freshman Football Coach and Director of Intramurals at Slippery Rock; Associate Varsity Football Coach at West Point; Freshman Football Coach at Dartmouth College; and Offensive Coordinator and Associate Professor of Health and Physical Education at East Stroudsburg University.

- **Paul Friedrich** (*Class of 1986/Track and Cross Country*) earned four varsity letters in cross country and three in track. He was a member of two WPIAL Championship cross country teams and one State Championship team. His track career is equally impressive in the 1600 and 3200 meters, as a WPIAL and State Runner up in the 3200 meters, and school record holder in both events.

He earned a track and cross country scholarship to the University of Pittsburgh, where he earned eight varsity letters and was named All Big East four times. He was the 1989 Big East Champion in the 3000 meter steeplechase and earned the 1990 University of Pittsburgh Award for combined athletic and academic excellence.

- **Jennifer Patterson** (*Class of 1998/Golf*) was a four-year varsity letter winner for the Black Hawks on her way to winning the 1995 and 1997 WPIAL Golf Championship as well as the 1997 State Championship. She was also a four-year varsity letter winner at Texas Christian University.
- **Ken Waldie** (*Class of 1973/Swimming*) was a four year varsity letter winner and the Captain of the 1973 WPIAL Championship Team. He qualified for seven WPIAL Championship events in three years and three State Championship events in three years. He was named All-WPIAL and All-State in 1973.

At the United States Naval Academy, Ken lettered in swimming, boxing and football. He also holds the distinction of being the only person to be Class President at the Naval Academy all four years. Tragically, Ken was a passenger on one of the airplanes that was flown into the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001.
