



MEET THE BETHEL PARK ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2008

Bethel Park High School will induct six new members into its Athletic Hall of Fame on Friday, September 12 before the start of the Bethel Park/North Hills Football game.

Members of the Class of 2008 are:

- **Richard Biernacki** (*Class of 1952/Football*) was a three-year letterman in football, playing on the offensive and defensive lines, as well as punting, kicking off and kicking extra points. He started every game for the 1951 undefeated team that won seven games against Class B opponents and three against Class A teams. He was named a WPIAL All-Star Honorable Mention by the *Post Gazette*. In college, Biernacki played football for Boston University and was a three year letterman, playing against future NFL greats Jim Brown and Rosey Grier.
- **Steve Berlin** (*Class of 1981/Football*) earned three letters in football, anchoring the line on both sides of the ball. He led the 1980 team through the playoffs and into Pitt Stadium, where the team finished as WPIAL Runner-Up.

His collegiate football career continued at Clemson University, where he played alongside William "Refrigerator" Perry, and was a member of the 1981 National Championship Team for the Tigers. He was named Clemson's Team Captain in 1985 and was named All-ACC First Team at Defensive End.

- **Dr. William Falce** (*Coach*) served as Bethel Park's Cross Country Coach for 21 years, Track and Field Coach for 17 years and Ninth Grade Football Coach for one year. He coached three WPIAL Championship Cross Country Teams (1984, 1985 and 1989) and two State Championships (1985 and 1989). His Track Teams were the 1971 WPIAL Champions and finished in second place at States. He received the National High School Coaching Award in 1988 by *Scholastic Coach Magazine* and the 2002 Tri-State Track Coaches' Association Lifetime Achievement Award.

- **Lisa Robinson** (*Class of 1987/Softball*) was a dominating pitcher, earning four varsity letters. Throughout her career at Bethel Park, she pitched 508 innings, striking out 527. As a senior, she pitched the Black Hawks to the Pennsylvania State Championship Game, where they lost in extra innings.

In her career, she pitched nine no-hitters and 14 one-hitters and was named Team MVP all four years at Bethel Park. She continued her softball career at Southern Illinois University.

- **Albert Wolf** (*Class of 1987/Swimming*) was a four year varsity letter winner, as well as a three time WPIAL and State Champion. In his junior and senior years, he was an All-American in two events and named an Academic All-American.

He was a four year letter winner at Harvard University and was named All-Ivy League his junior and senior years. Additionally, he founded the Harvard Water Skiing Team in his junior year and competed in that sport as well his final two years of college.

- **Brian Wolf** (*Class of 1989/Swimming*) was a four year letter winner and a member of the team that was a four-time WPIAL and State Champion, going undefeated over the entire four year span. During his career at Bethel Park, he was a five-time WPIAL and State Champion as well as a six-time All-American.

He continued swimming at Dartmouth College, where he set numerous college, team and pool records and was a Finalist at the Eastern Seaboard Championships.
