



## BETHEL PARK ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME TO INDUCT SEVEN

Seven new members will be inducted into the Bethel Park Athletic Hall of Fame on Friday, October 9 prior to the beginning of the Bethel Park/Upper St. Clair Football Game at 7:30 PM at Bethel Park Stadium.

Members of this year's class include:

- **Alan Carter** – Class of 2003/Swimming -- Alan was one of the most accomplished athletes in Bethel Park men's swimming history. He was a four-year letterman and holds two school records, in addition to numerous WPIAL and PIAA medals. He received a full scholarship to Notre Dame, where he had a successful swimming career.
- **Matt Fornadel** – Class of 1993/Football and Basketball – Matt was a three year starter in football, where he earned All-State and All-American honors. In basketball he was the team captain and the leading rebounder on the 1993 Section Champion team. Matt attended Penn State, where he was a four-year letterman in football and was a team captain in 1997.
- **Jeff Koller** – Class of 2003/Football/Swimming/Baseball – Jeff was a versatile athlete at Bethel Park, lettering in three sports. In football he ran for over 1,300 yards and 15 touchdowns in 2002. He was a three-time All-American in swimming, where he also earned 10 WPIAL and two PIAA medals. He batted .508 for the baseball team. He played football for two years at the Naval Academy and is now a Lieutenant in the U.S. Marine Corps.
- **Joseph Nicoletti** – Coach/Baseball, Football and Track. Joseph coached for over 30 years at Bethel Park, serving as a Head Baseball Coach and Assistant Coach for football and track. Fourteen athletes in the Bethel Park Athletic Hall of Fame were coached by him.

- **Ken Travis** – Class of 1953/Football – Ken is the newest “Grayhawk” inductee into the Hall of Fame for his accomplishments on the football field, where he was a three year letterman and starter. He was named All-WPIAL his senior year. He played college football at Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut where he was a three year letterman and two year starter, as well as the team MVP as a senior. He is now an anesthesiologist in Massachusetts.
- **Craig White** – Class of 1986/Baseball – As a two year starter as an infielder and pitcher, Craig led the WPIAL in doubles and runs scored. He starred for four years at Slippery Rock University, where he was twice named a First Team All-American. After college, Craig played several seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers minor league system and for the Boston Red Sox in 1995 during the Major League Baseball strike.
- **Phillip “Duce” Williams** – Class of 1988/Football – Duce was a three year starter for the Black Hawks as a running back and was named to the WPIAL and PIAA All-Star Teams. He received a full scholarship to the University of Kentucky, where he starred for three years as a linebacker. Currently he is a newspaper executive living in Tennessee.

Following the game, a reception will be held at the Bethel Park Community Center for the inductees, their families and their friends. The reception is free and the public is invited to attend to congratulate this year’s honorees.
