Dear Families,

***Re: Multiple District Students Test Positive for COVID-19***

Earlier today, multiple students at Bethel Park High School, including one remote learner, reported testing positive for COVID-19. Also, students at Lincoln and Washington Elementary Schools tested positive for COVID-19 over the weekend.

In accordance with Bethel Park School District's health and safety protocols, the individual will remain isolated at home until his or her symptoms have passed and he or she has been cleared by a medical professional as being no longer contagious.

Anyone who is considered to have been in close contact with the individuals has been informed of the situation and has been instructed to follow the required quarantine at home protocols for 10 days. Please be aware that quarantining in this situation does not necessarily mean that these other individuals have tested positive for COVID-19. It simply means that they may have been exposed to the virus, and therefore they must remain quarantined to avoid potentially spreading it to others.

If you have not been contacted with specific instructions, it means that you or your student have not been exposed to COVID-19 through the students and therefore should continue as scheduled without interruption.

Please note that for transparency reasons, our [COVID-19 dashboard](#), which is located on the District's website, lists all reported case counts involving Bethel Park School District students and staff, regardless of their educational pathway. A separate graphic at the bottom of the page lists the number of active cases among in-person learners and staff. Communications are sent out only when we have active cases of students or staff who have reported to any of our schools or if there is a change in any of our schools' operational status.

As a reminder, if you or a child in your care test positive for the coronavirus, you must inform your school nurse or school administration as soon as possible and begin isolating immediately. Going forward, our families will have an even greater level of responsibility to help mitigate the spread of coronavirus in Bethel Park schools.
