#### What is Transition?

IDEA 2004 states that secondary transition is:

- "...a coordinated set of activities for a child with a disability that is designed with a results-oriented process"
- promotes movement from school to post-school activities, including post-secondary education, vocational training, integrated employment, continuing and adult education, adult services, independent living, or community participation.

#### **Definition of Transition**

Based on the individual student's needs, strengths, preferences and interests and.....



#### **Definition of Transition**

- Development of employment and other post-school adult living objectives
- When appropriate acquisition of daily living skills and functional vocational evaluation
- Including instruction, related services and community experiences

# Predictors of Post-Secondary Success

- Students' ability to maintain a paid job during high school years
- Involvement of students in their IEP and transition planning process
- Ability for students to understand their disability, strengths and needs
- Students having the opportunity to develop selfdetermination skills

#### When do we begin to plan?

- Must occur no later that the first IEP when the student turns 14 years old
- Can begin earlier
  - Motivation
  - Course selection
  - Targeted ESY program

#### Who is responsible?

- Transition team members include:
  - Parents
  - Students
  - General & Special Education Personnel
  - Agency Representative

The successful transition of students with disabilities is the responsibility of all members of the IEP Team and requires considerable collaboration.

#### Pros of Student Involvement

- IDEA requires the students be involved in making choices concerning their transition plan
- Students are provided the opportunity to learn more about their strengths and skills and be able to share their goals
- Helps them learn more about their disability and to be part of the process of identifying supports
- Fosters a greater sense of ownership in the plan
- Provides motivation to continue to work on the goals

#### Post Secondary Goals

- Post-secondary goals must match the student's graduation/exit option
- Course of study must support the post-secondary education/training, employment and if needed, the independent living goals of the student



## Post-Secondary Education

- Education is defined as enrollment in ...
  - Community College (2 year program)
  - College/University (4 year program)



### Post-Secondary Education

- Training is defined as
  - High school completing document or certificate class (Adult Basic Education, GED)
  - Short-term education or employment training program
  - Vocational Technical School
  - Certificate program (less than 2 years)
  - Continuing education/life long learning



#### Employment

- Competitive
  - Full or part time
  - Integrated setting
  - Compensation at or above minimum wage



- Supported
  - Job coach
  - Integrated settings
  - Individuals with more significant disabilities
  - Volunteer opportunities

### Independent Living

- Skills necessary in order for an adult to function independently
  - Leisure/Recreation
  - Community Participation
  - Access how do I get where I need to go?
  - Personal Hygiene







#### Recipe for Quality Transition Plan

- Age appropriateness of activities
- Functional skills

- What's the plan?
- Skills that can be generalized (used in more than one environment or situation)
- Activities based on the student's preferences and interests
- Directly related to the outcomes of the transition plan



## Effective planning

"Effective transition planning depends on looking at your child as he/she is today and imaging what services and supports will be needed to achieve your child's dreams tomorrow."

- Participate along with your child in the IEP process
- Talk to your child about the future and what he/she wants to be
- Help your child identify his/her own strengths and interests
- Help set realistic goals for your child
- Provide opportunities to make choices
- Help your child learn about his/her disability and how to ask for the supports he/she needs

#### What can I do to help?

- Teach your child social skills such as how to accept constructive criticism and how to respond to authority
- Create opportunities for your child to be socially active in the community
- Help your child learn job-related skills such as punctuality, dressing appropriately & work ethic
- Learn about community agencies that provide services to support
- Keep a transition folder
