Dear Bethel Park Families,

Re: Scheduling Reminder

We hope this communication finds everyone healthy and safe and that you are enjoying your Winter Break. We just wanted to take this opportunity to remind our families of our Safe Return to School Plan and to alert families of students who receive life skills or autistic support of one scheduling change.

- Students who receive life skills or autistic support, who were originally scheduled to return to in-person instruction on Jan. 4, **will now report on Monday, Jan. 11.**
- Bethel Park School District will remain in a full remote instructional model through Friday, Jan. 8, with students in the A/B hybrid model scheduled to return to in-person instruction beginning on **Monday, Jan. 11.**
- Kindergarten and Preschool programs will also be held virtually through Friday, Jan. 8. Beginning on **Monday, Jan. 11,** Bethel Park Kindergarteners will return to in-person instruction up to four days per week with asynchronous instruction on Fridays.
- The District will continue to provide transportation to students who have approved outside placements (vocational schools, private schools, etc.) if those schools continue to offer in-person instruction.

Finally, parents and guardians of students in all grades can sign up for free “Grab ‘N Go” meal pickup by clicking on the [Bethel Park Cyber Breakfast and Lunch Order Form](#) found on our website. Meal pickups will continue to occur at the high school daily on weekdays from 11:30 a.m. until 12:45 p.m. Please remember to place your order by Friday morning, for the following week’s order.

Families who are uncomfortable sending their children to in-person schooling under the current conditions **will continue to have the option of participating in full remote instruction.** Please work through your child’s building principal to facilitate any necessary changes to your child’s learning track.

We sincerely appreciate the Bethel Park community’s continued support, patience, and understanding during this unprecedented crisis and we look forward to our students’ safe return.
